Presentation and dates

This two-week 40-hour course will cover key issues in language test design and validation. The course will be held at the Universidad de Jaén (Spain) from June 22nd to July 3rd 2026.

During the **first week** we will define and learn how to design the main parts of a test: construct, specifications, components (listening, reading, writing, speaking and interaction) through theoretical and practical sessions. Participants will have the opportunity of sharing their own work with colleagues from other institutions and major examining boards.

During the **second week** we will focus on the statistical analysis of aspects related to validity arguments. We will use both Classical Test Theory and Item-Response Theory to analyze facility values, discrimination indexes, internal reliability, bias, variable maps, etc. and we will see how analytic scales can be validated through Rasch models. *No previous knowledge of statistics is necessary.*

The course will be taught by experts in language test design with extensive experience: **Brian North**, co-author of the Common European Framework for Languages and the Companion Volume (1.5 hours); **Adolfo Sánchez**, expert on mediation at the Universidad de Granada (2 hours); **Javier Fruns**, Head of language assessment at the Instituto Cervantes (4 horas); **David Bradshaw**, Senior assessment Services and Recognition Manager for Cambridge University Press and Assessment (4 hours); **Carmen Álvarez**, Assessment coordinator at the Language Center of the Universidad Politécnica de Madrid (4 hours); **Jane Lloyd**, ALTE Services Unit Consultant (2.5 hours) and **Joaquín M. Cruz**, Deputy Director and Assessment Coordinator at the Center for Higher Studies in Modern Languages at the Universidad de Jaén (22 hours).

The course will be held in **English** but its theoretical and practical contents can be applied to test development and validation in any language other than English. **Computers** will be necessary for the second week. The Universidad de Jaén will provide participants with the necessary computers and pre-installed software, chiefly Word, Excel, SPSS, Winsteps and Facets. Participants who want to use their own laptops will have to make sure that they have access to the aforementioned software because the University of Jaén will not provide individual licenses. According to Spanish regulation, this course is considered as a *Diploma de Postgrado* (postgraduate course) **worth 5 ECTS credits**.

Contents

This course will have **10 sessions**. Most of these sessions will include **2 hours of theory and 2 hours of practical work** with a 30-minute break. During the **first week** (22 - 26 June 2026) we will define and work on the main parts of a test. During the **second week** (29 June - 3 July 2026) we will focus on statistical analysis using Classical Test Theory and Item-Response Theory. *No previous knowledge of statistics is necessary.* **Participants do not have to work outside the lesson hours** and they will receive a link with the materials for the course one week before its beginning. The content of both weeks is broken down as follows:

Week 1

- Introduction
- The CEFR CV, mediation and new challenges in language assessment
- Listening comprehension
- Reading comprehension
- Oral and written production

Week 2

- Introduction to statistical analysis and Classical Test Theory (I)
- Classical Test Theory (II)
- Item Response Theory (I, *item analysis*)
- Item Response Theory (II, *rating scale analysis*)
- Wrap-up and guided visit to the campus

During the first week there will be an **optional afternoon session** in which participants will have the opportunity of sharing the work that they carry out in their institutions. There will also be a **gala dinner** to be celebrated on Friday 26th at the main hall of the local [Castle of Santa Catalina](#).

The last day of the course participants will be offered a guided visit to the main facilities of the campus, which includes a **visit to our private art collection [Cesáreo Aguilera](#)**, which currently has on display several pieces by Picasso and Tàpies among other modernist artists.

Prepare your stay in Andalusia

The city of Jaén is placed in the Spanish region of Andalusia, one of the richest areas of the country in cultural terms. Read the recommendations below to plan ahead and make the most of your time in Jaén.

Traveling and accommodation

If you need any **assistance** while preparing your stay in Jaén, do not hesitate to contact the Director of the diploma, Dr. Joaquín Cruz (jtrapero [arroba] ujaen [punto] es (jtrapero[at]ujaen[dot]es); +34683750037). He will be more than happy to recommend the best option for you and to help you in case you need local help.

As regards **traveling**, the closest airport to Jaén is the [airport of Granada](#), which is only one hour away by bus. You can also fly to [Seville](#) or [Málaga](#) and then take a bus or a train to Jaén. The international [airport of Madrid](#) is also a good option since it is well communicated by train.

There are several hotels for your **accommodation** in Jaén. [Hotel Infanta Cristina](#) is within a 15-minute walk from the [venues of the course](#). If you want to be downtown, you can choose [Hotel Xauen](#), [Hotel Europa](#) or [Hotel Condestable Iranzo](#). There is also the possibility of choosing the university dorm of the Universidad de Jaén, the [Colegio Mayor Domingo Savio](#), which is opposite the [venues of the course](#) and [whose prices you can check here](#). This is the cheapest option, but notice that you may have to share the facilities of the dorm with regular students, which tend to be noisy. Finally, you can also check availability at our [local hostel](#), which is situated in the old town.

We have **free parking space** in case you decide to travel by car. The parking lot is open from Monday to Friday from 8:00 until 21:00.

Visit the province of Jaén

In the **capital** you can visit the [Cathedral](#) or the local [Castle of Santa Catalina](#), where the gala dinner of the course will be held. We also recommend you to visit the [Museum of Iberian Art](#), the only museum of its kind in the world, and the [Arabian Baths](#), the biggest in Europe. During the weekend you can also prepare visits to different parts of the **province** such as [Úbeda and Baeza](#), two world heritage cities which you can reach by bus. If you like nature, you can also visit the [Parque Natural de Cazorla, Segura y Las villas](#).

Enjoy our gastronomy

If there is something that stands out in Jaén it is gastronomy. We are the top producers in the world of **extra virgin olive oil** (known as AOVE from the *Spanish Aceite de Oliva Virgen Extra*). We recommend you to visit local shops and check our world famous selection of [AOVEs Jaén Selección](#), a choice of the best AOVEs in the world which can be bought in most shops downtown.

We are also known by our **Tapas**. When you order a drink in most local bars you will be served a small portion of food (or *tapa*) for free. This is the best way to try different local dishes for free while you visit the center of the city, and perhaps a good way to socialize with the rest of participants in the course. Check [some of the best places for tapas in this article of the Repsol Guide](#). If you want something more sophisticated, you can always

book a table in [Bagá](#), our Star Michelin restaurant which is within the [top-5 restaurants in the world according to OAD](#). If you like Japanese fusion food, you definitely must visit [Ka-Oru](#), most likely one of our next Michelin restaurants.

Other things you need to know

As regards **money**, the local currency is the Euro and, since Jaén is not a very big town, exchanging money may be difficult. Our recommendation is to exchange money before you arrive to Spain, or at the airport once you arrive. You will not have any problem to exchange money in Madrid or Málaga airports, while in other airports (such as Granada or Seville) it may be more difficult. Of course, you can always withdraw money from ATMs with your credit card, but this may have extra cost depending on the conditions applied by your bank. Most shops, bars and restaurants accept credit card, and if you do not plan to use cash, using your card may be a very good option. If your bank applies extra charges, you may want to consider using options such as Revolut.

If you want to use **public transportation** within the town, buses and taxis are the best choice. Buses run from 7:00 to 21:30 approximately, and you can pay inside the bus in cash (not with credit card). Taxis are available around the clock and you can pick one by phoning one of the two local companies at 953222222 or at 953271010 (using +34 if you are phoning from outside Spain). They normally answer the phone in Spanish. At this moment companies such as Uber or Cabify do not operate in Jaén.
